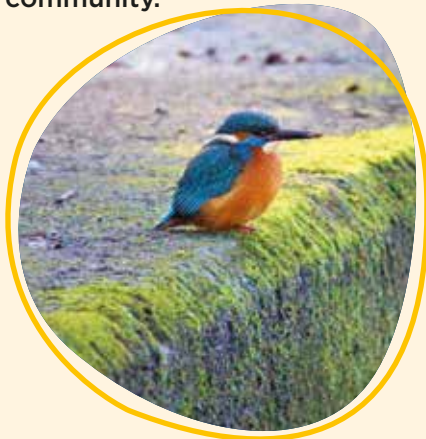
Local Nature Reserve and Castlemilk Park Map

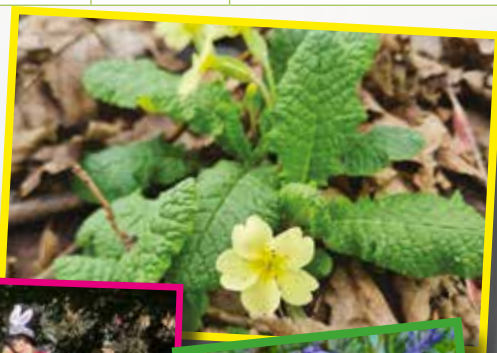
Take Care in the Park

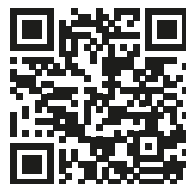
Transport
